


Dear Mr. Brinkman:

The Camp Stanley Storage Activity (CSSA), McAlester Army Ammunition Plant, US Army Field Support Command, Army Materiel Command, U.S. Army is submitting, as required by Section 106 regulations of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, the proposed demolition of Building 81. Building 81 was built in 1942 and was used as a guard shelter and a horse remount station for perimeter patrols. It is a small, dilapidated structure constructed of concrete blocks, measuring 14ft X 28ft. Demolition of this building is required to eliminate a blind curve driving hazard, where several near miss vehicle collisions have occurred. Future increased use of this road pose a significant safety issue. CSSA has four similar shelters, thus there will still be examples of horse remount stations on the facility. A map depicting the Building 81 location and pictures of the structure are attached.

In accordance with Section 800.6 of the Section 106 Regulation, we are requesting that the state Historical Commission (SHPO) review our proposal and provide approval or comment at your soonest opportunity.
