Dear Mr. and Mrs. Srp:

Thank you for your recent letter and telephone conversation expressing your concern about emissions from the referenced project. To protect the public health and welfare, the Federal and Texas Clean Air Acts (TCAA) have led to a number of rules and regulations designed to minimize emissions of air contaminants from all new and modified facilities. Regulation VI of the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) requires that owners or operators of the facilities obtain a permit from the TNRCC.

In the permit review, the applicant must demonstrate that the proposed facility will use the best available emission controls to minimize emissions. Information about toxicity and odor of the air contaminants is used to evaluate whether the emissions may cause adverse public health effects or nuisance conditions. Further controls may need to be negotiated with the applicant before the reviewing engineer prepares a permit for approval. Generally, a permit cannot be denied solely on the basis of the facility location because the TCAA does not grant zoning authority to the TNRCC. If a permit is granted and the facility is operating, our staff will confirm that the required controls have been installed and are operating properly. Also, follow-up inspections will be conducted to monitor the performance of the facility.


