SUBJECT: Sampling of Water Well RFR-10, Located at 25490 Old Fredericksburg Rd.

Dear [Redacted]:

Camp Stanley Storage Activity (CSSA) collected a groundwater sample from your well (RFR-10) on 6/4/12. This sample was submitted to a laboratory contracted by CSSA's environmental contractor for volatile organic compound (VOC) analysis. This letter provides you with the VOC data from the laboratory results and a formal thank you for your assistance in this groundwater monitoring effort.

An abbreviated summary of analytical results compared to maximum contaminant levels (MCLs) allowed in drinking water by the U.S. EPA under the Safe Drinking Water Act is provided below:

\*The "F" qualifier indicates the value is above the laboratory method detection limit, but below the laboratory reporting limit for the compound.

Based on the analytical data, levels of the VOC PCE, TCE, and *cis*-1,2-DCE were identified in the water sample from your well before granular activated carbon (GAC) filtration. Results from the laboratory analysis are provided as an attachment for the above sampling event. The concentrations reported for the VOCs PCE and TCE were above the MCL in the past. Therefore, a filtration system has been installed on your well.

The filtration system was installed by Carbonair Environmental Systems of San Marcos, Texas. The system will remain in operation for the foreseeable future or until significant reductions in contamination levels are seen in the water in your well before it enters the filtration system. As we discussed at the time of installation, CSSA will continue to be responsible for all costs associated with operation and maintenance of this system. CSSA will continue to send a representative every 3 weeks to exchange the five-micron pre-and post-filters in the system.


Carbonair exchanged the first carbon canister and performed other routine maintenance on your system in July 2012. If you experience any problems with the system, please let the installer or CSSA know immediately. Carbonair is very responsive and can make additional

maintenance visits if needed. Post-GAC samples were not collected this event but are scheduled to be collected again during the September 2012 sampling event.

As part of the ongoing CSSA environmental program, we are continuing to investigate and cleanup VOC source areas on the installation and to track these compounds in groundwater on- and off-post. As part of this effort, your well is scheduled to be sampled again in September 2012.

Again, we would like to thank you for your cooperation. We regret that your well has been impacted, but remain committed to making sure your water is safe to use and keeping you informed.
