Thank you for your phone inquiry on November 20, 2017 regarding well LS-5. Camp Stanley Storage Activity (CSSA) understands that the Korean Catholic Martyrs Church has a plan to place a mobile home on the property in December 2017 and provide potable water service from LS-5.

Upon locating the well, you noticed the well was locked and could not get the water to run from the faucet located on the wellhead. Water will only flow from the wellhead faucet when the well pump is actively running. In its current configuration, the well pump will only run when the water pressure in the bladder tank is lowered by either opening a faucet located within the Granular Activated Carbon (GAC) system shed, or at the household that is currently served by the well at 7579 Curres Creek Road.

As part of the CSSA groundwater monitoring program, CSSA collects samples from your wells LS-5 and LS-6 after the water is processed through the GAC filtration systems. Both wellheads, LS-5 and LS-6, are accessible by you. However, the GAC treatment systems are locked to ensure that the system cannot be tampered with, or inadvertently altered by unqualified persons. At your request, we can provide you a key to the GAC systems on your property. CSSA recommends that you do not alter the system (or open/close any valves), such that you may inadvertently deliver untreated water to your water consumers. In short, the water supply connection must come after the GAC treatment system (shed), and not between the wellhead and the GAC system. CSSA would like to collaborate with your maintenance personnel once the mobile home is placed on the property to validate the potable water connection to well LS-5 serving the mobile home is coming from the correct side of the GAC system.

Again, we would like to thank you for your cooperation. We regret that your wells have been impacted, but remain committed to making sure your water is safe to use and keeping you informed. In addition to delivery of this letter by e-mail we will also
