Dear Colonel Schmelling:

The Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) received your Final Report dated April 1995 documenting that closure activities for the referenced waste management unit have been completed. The Final Report includes certifications by yourself and Mr. J. David Highland, an independent registered professional engineer, certifying that the unit was closed in accordance with the TNRCC Risk Reduction Rules (RRR) Standard No. 1, pursuant to Title 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 35 Subchapters A and S.

In order to attain RRR Standard No. 1, all industrial solid waste and municipal hazardous waste and waste residues must be removed or decontaminated from affected media (i.e., soil, surface water, groundwater, air) to naturally occurring background levels. Waste constituents which are not naturally occurring (such as most organic chemicals) must be cleaned to the analytical method detection limits. EPA defines these limits as Practical Quantitation Limits - the minimum concentration of a substance that can be measured within specified limits of precision and accuracy under routine operating lab conditions.

The TNRCC staff has completed review of the Final Report. Based on the information submitted in the Final Report and other pertinent information available to our staff, it appears that closure of the F-14 Accumulation Site has attained Risk Reduction Standard No. 1. The U.S. Army Camp Stanley is released from deed recordation and post-closure care requirements for this unit.

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Please be aware that it is the continuing obligation of persons associated with a site to assure that industrial solid waste and municipal hazardous waste are managed in a manner that does not cause the discharge or imminent threat of discharge of waste into or adjacent to waters in the state, a nuisance, or the endangerment of the public health and welfare as required by Title 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §335.4. If the actual closure fails to comply with these requirements, the burden remains upon the U.S. Army Camp Stanley to take any necessary and authorized action to correct such conditions. A TNRCC field inspector may review your Final Report and may conduct a closure inspection of the site.
